- 3 Rhythm** Strauss's rhythmic choices often mirrored the emotional intensity of his music He employed a wide range of rhythmic patterns from simple and flowing to complex and driving He often used syncopation and irregular meters to create a sense of rhythmic excitement Example In the famous Ride of the Valkyries from *Die Walküre* Strauss uses a driving rhythmic pattern to create a sense of power and urgency evoking the image of the Valkyries riding through the sky
- 4 Timbre** Strauss was a master orchestrator using the unique sonic qualities of different instruments to create a rich and varied soundscape He often employed unusual instrumental combinations such as the use of the English horn in *Der Rosenkavalier* to create unique and memorable musical effects Example In *Also Sprach Zarathustra* Strauss's famous tone poem he uses a wide array of orchestral instruments including trumpets timpani and horns to create a sense of cosmic grandeur and awe

unlocking the masters the life and music of Richard Strauss 1864-1949 span what was arguably the most turbulent period in human history encompassing the Franco-Prussian War the unification of Germany and two World Wars he was one of the very last composers to have started his career in service to the old European aristocracy but near the end of his life the continent lay in shambles and he faced financial ruin even as he remained Germany's greatest living composer virtually from the day they were written Strauss's tone poems from the late nineteenth century works such as *Don Juan* *Till Eulenspiegel* also *Sprechchor Zarathustra* and *Death and Transfiguration* have been repertory standards so have the operas *Salome* *Elektra* and *Der Rosenkavalier* and yet a tremendous quantity of very good music both early and late has only recently come to the attention of musicians and music lovers alike this owner's manual accompanied by full-length audio tracks surveys all the major works with orchestra symphonies concertos tone poems operas ballets suites and songs many of them will be new even to listeners familiar with the popular pieces part of a vast legacy of immaculately crafted beautiful music that deserves to be rediscovered and treasured

second edition includes expanded biographical section and discussion of strauss s music richard strauss s long life spanned nearly a century from the consolidation of wagner s fame in the 1860s to the age of post serialism and the dawn of electronics when he died in 1949 for 79 of his 85 years he composed songs chamber music a series of brilliant tone poems and the great ballets and operas which he created for the legendary stars of dresden and vienna he was also one of the outstanding conductors of his time directing opera companies in weimar munich berlin and vienna his life was rich in controversy from the outrage caused by the operas salome and elektra to the years under the nazi regime in his survey of the music rejecting the generally accepted view that strauss s genius declined in his middle years michael kennedy traces refinements of style from the early 1920s to strauss s late works the first edition of this book was published by dent in 1976

strongly influencing european musical life from the 1880s through the first world war and remaining highly productive into the 1940s richard strauss enjoyed a remarkable career in a constantly changing artistic and political climate this volume presents six original essays on strauss s musical works including tone poems lieder and operas and brings together letters memoirs and criticism from various periods of the composer s life many of these materials appear in english for the first time in the essays leon botstein contradicts the notion of the composer s stylistic about face after elektra

derrick puffett reinforces the argument for strauss s artistic consistency by tracing in the tone poems and operas the phenomenon of pitch specificity james hepokoski establishes strauss as an early modernist in an examination of macbeth michael steinberg probes the composer s political sensibility as expressed in the 1930s through his music and use of such texts as friedenstag and daphne bryan gilliam discusses the genesis of both the text and the music in the final scene of daphne timothy jackson in his thorough source study argues for a new addition to the so called four last songs among the correspondence are previously untranslated letters between strauss and his post hofmannsthal librettist joseph gregor the memoirs range from early biographical sketches to rudolf hartmann s moving account of his last visit with strauss shortly before the composer s death critical reviews include recently translated essays by theodor adorno guido adler paul bekker and julius korngold publisher description
